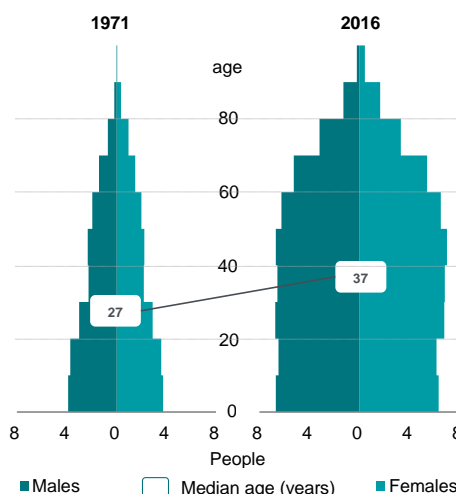
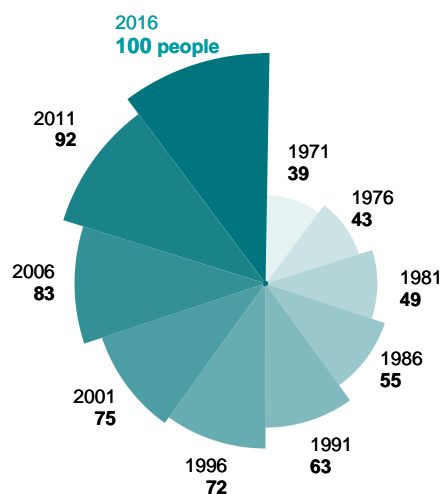


Queensland as a village of 100 people

15 people are seniors (65 years and over)



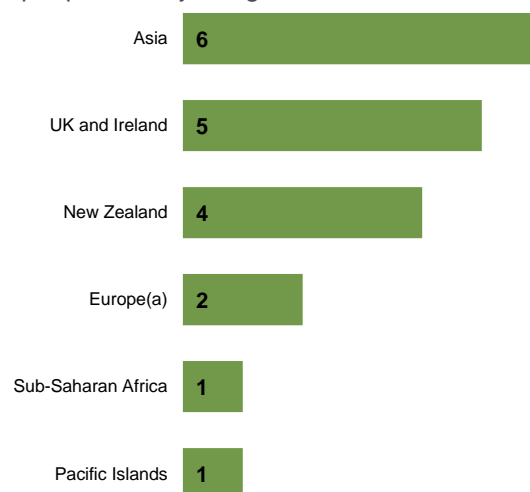
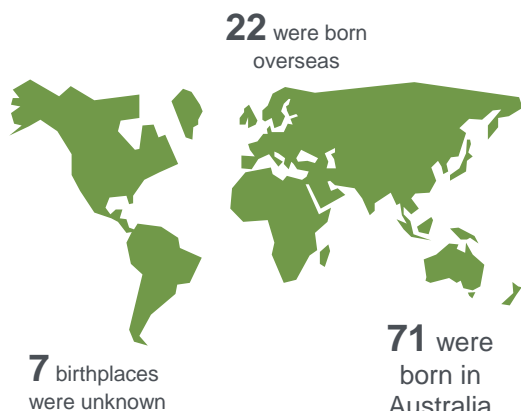
19 people in the village are children (0–14 years)



8 people in the village are living alone

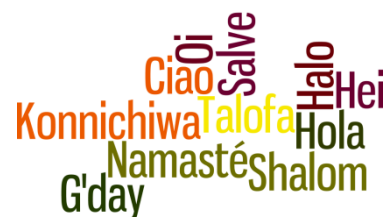
Of the **100 people** in our village...

15 did voluntary work



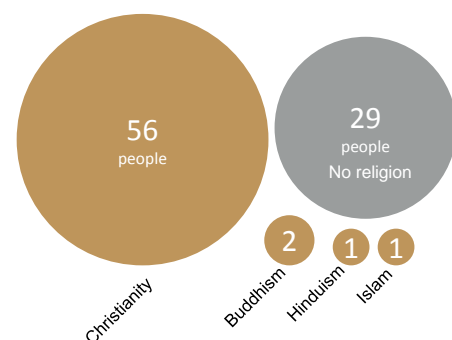
16 are attending school or preschool
